



Care Quality Commission publishes Stroke Review

The CQC have completed a major review of stroke services across the country and have revealed that there are large levels of inconsistencies in care delivery in relation to:

- peoples' transfer from hospital to home
- access to specialist community-based rehabilitation services, such as speech and language therapy
- support for carers
- information given to people around the time they leave hospital
- how well services take account of the communication needs of people with aphasia

In other news...

- We have launched two new services this month, after frequent requests from our customers. You can now purchase our Typing Service via our Writers' Services Pages and our LinkedIn Profile Writing Service through our Job Seeker's Pages.
- The Foundation Trust Governors Association has called for the Care Quality Commission (CQC) to assess the quality of governors. The Association's proposal, if implemented, would mean that a trust could potentially lose its registration with the regulator if it did not have sufficient evidence to prove that its governors met all of the required quality standards. The request comes after the Health Bill confirmed plans in the white paper to strip Monitor of its role in assessing governance in the foundation trust sector. In removing these powers from Monitor, governors rather than the regulator will ultimately become responsible for safeguarding the public's interest in a particular healthcare trust.
