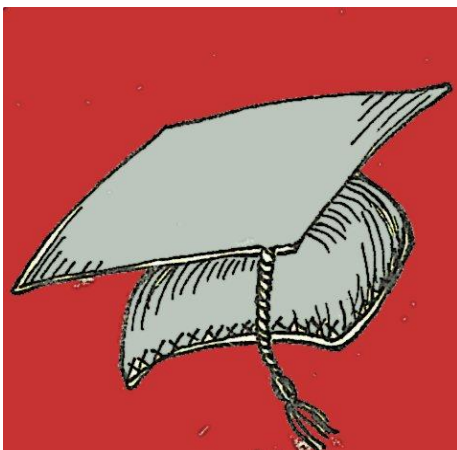
The release of these reports further stresses the CQC's commitment to increasing the robustness of its compliance monitoring over this coming year.

Students to 'buy' University places



Yes that's right...the government is proposing to allow institutions to charge British undergraduate students the same fees as overseas students are currently charged in order to secure a place at some of the country's most competitive universities.

Under this scheme, these 'extra' places can only be taken up by students who are willing to pay the higher fee rate without any funding support for either the fee rate or their cost of living expenses.

Despite criticisms, ministers state that this scheme would release additional funding for less financially secure students.
