## Warner Bros are in Partnership with J.K. Rowling

The script for the film is inspired by Harry Potter's Hogwarts textbook *Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them* and the adventures of author Newt Scamander. The script will be an original story by Rowling.

Although Rowling is going back to the world of fantasy that kept her busy for so long, she has been quick to confirm that *Fantastic Beasts and Where to Find Them* is neither a prequel nor a sequel to the Harry Potter series, but an extension of the wizarding world.

The magical society set out in the book will be familiar to anyone who has read the Harry Potter books or seen the films, but Newt's story will start in New York, seventy years before Harry Potter's begins.

Warner Bros approached Rowling with the idea of turning *Fantastic Beasts* into a film. Passionate about her own characters and the world she created for them, she then pitched her own idea for a film to Warner Bros, which began Rowling's screenwriting debut.



## The CQC has been Shortlisted for a Charity Times Award

The Care Quality Commission has been shortlisted for this year's Charity Times Award in the category of cross-sector partnership of the year.



The healthcare regulator has been jointly nominated in this category along with Choice Support, one of the support organisations they work with to recruit and support people with experience of health and social care services, called Experts by Experience by the CQC.

Experts by Experience bring insights to the work of the CQC that cannot be captured in any other way. They take part in inspections of health and social care services and CQC visits to monitor the use of the Mental Health Act. During inspections, they spend time talking to people who use the service and observe the environment. Their findings are used to support the inspector's judgment and can be included in their report.

The CQC is among six partnerships to make the shortlist for the award.

The winner of the award will be announced on 16 October 2013.

This year, Edinburgh and King's College London have moved into the top 20 of the QS World University rankings. While Cambridge, UCL, Imperial and Oxford all made it into the top 10.

The United States currently dominate the rankings table. Massachusetts Institute of Technology sits at the top of the table, Harvard is in second place and Cambridge, in third position, is the top UK University.

There were eight UK universities in the top 50 and 18 in the top 100, with graduates from Oxford and Cambridge rated as the world's most employable by 27,000 global graduate employers who were polled for the ranking.

The results show that the prestige of a UK degree is recognised by employers around the world, and the brand-name value of Oxbridge has so far survived any negative publicity following the tuition fee hikes and student protests.

However, the rankings also suggest that UK universities struggle to keep up with the US when it comes to cutting-edge research. Of UK universities, only Cambridge made the top 30 for research citations, with UCL, Oxford and Imperial in the top 50.

Despite doing so well, there are those who warn that unless the UK puts more funding into higher education its leading position could slip. The UK does not invest as much money into higher education as other countries, so it is unrealistic to expect UK universities to continue this level of performance.
