Each of these stories represents a real moment in history when Britain was experiencing great social and cultural change. This season of films aims to explore these changes. Themes about the role of women, class, sexuality and impact of the First World War will link the individual stories chosen.

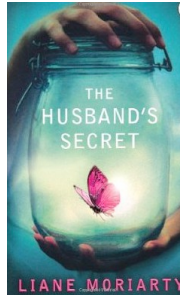

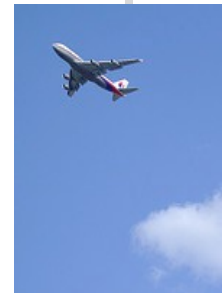
