

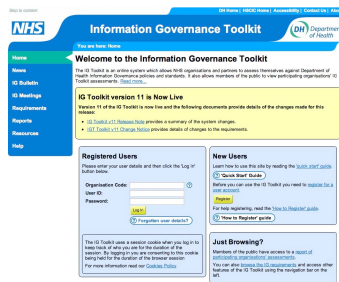
Welcome to the June edition of the Words Worth Reading Ltd newsletter. We have been working with healthcare clients to help them begin preparing for their Information Governance internal audits. We have also been busy working alongside a number of students, proofreading dissertations and thesis, so they are ready for submission dates and the end of the academic year.

Version 13 of the Information Governance Toolkit is Now Live

Information Governance is the framework for handling personal information in a confidential and secure manner to appropriate ethical and quality standards in a modern health service. It ensures that all information is stored, processed and managed securely, legally, accurately, efficiently, and in line with industry regulations and standards.

The Information Governance Toolkit (IGT) is an online system, which allows NHS organisations to assess themselves against Department of Health Information Governance policies and standards.

The latest version of the IGT, version 13, became active at the beginning of June 2015. There are a number of changes to this new version of the Toolkit.



These changes include:

1. Guidance on IG leadership has been added following the Government's response to the Caldicott 2 Review.
2. Training options for IG leads have been expanded.
3. Policy and protocol guideline requirements have been expanded to include cyber security.
4. Integrated models need to be reflected in information sharing agreements.
5. There is a greater emphasis on ensuring that service users are aware of how their personal information is used and shared.
6. The auditing of staff access to confidential information has been strengthened.
7. Guidance has been added relating to the NHS Constitution; Rights and Pledges.
8. Guidance has been added relating to secure file transfer.
9. Lifecycle management guidance has been updated, particularly around patching and retirement / replacement lifecycle for hardware and software.
10. Guidance has been updated on the NHS Litigation Authority Risk Management Standards and the Safety and Learning Service.
11. There is additional guidance on the retention and disposal of records.
12. The guidance on the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) has been updated to reflect the Protection of Freedoms Act 2012 amendments.

Author Tags on Facebook



Facebook has introduced a way for publishers to reach new audiences with a new feature called Author Tags. When implemented on a website, Author Tags allow people to easily follow the author of a piece of content they found on Facebook.

Author Tags are integrated in the byline of story preview in the news feed — the tags link to the author's Facebook page or profile along with the option to follow them.

With this new feature, publishers have an opportunity to increase their audience with followers who are genuinely engaged with their content.

With the connection made on Facebook, publishers can nurture that connection into something more meaningful with one-on-one conversation or Q&A's with their followers.

New Shopping Experience on Twitter



Penguin Random House is a launch partner for a new initiative by Twitter to turn the social media platform into a shopping experience.

When you click on book related branding by Penguin Random House, such as a Tweet about a latest bestseller it will take you to a dedicated product page within Twitter.

You can then check out tweets by other others talking about the book and view the description of the title. If you like what you see there is a buy button and Twitter handles the payment processing. The shipping cost of the book is factored into the cost and the pricing is very respectable.

If you visit the Penguin Random House Twitter profile, you will see a new entry below their photos called [Browse Collection](#). There are [nine books](#) available to preview that were all added on 18th June 2015. Clicking on the image will bring up the dedicated product page for that particular title.

Although Twitter has experimented with shopping links in the past, this could be their best version yet.
